Home & School will provide a picnic type lunch but are asking those who are able to also bring along some type of a "treat" item to share. This might be fruit, cookies, brownies, etc.


Students have been busy contacting sponsors for the event. Some individuals may offer to pay the student "per mile" for their activity and some may just offer a "flat rate" for the event.
